### To be a growing church, God's gift to the community

#### **Dear Friends**

The Church celebrates Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent, on the 2<sup>nd</sup> March. This year we will have the Archdeacon of Harlow with us at St. Martin's at the 10 am service as she will be going from us to start a Lenten walking pilgrimage around this area.

For many years I dreaded the Ash Wednesday service with its offer for all to come and have an ash cross drawn upon their forehead to show a penitent spirit. Why? Because I did not understand the concept of forgiveness, it was not something really practised in my family as I grew up. The reality is that if you do not understand what forgiveness is, it is really hard to admit one might have failed or screwed up as there is only condemnation available.



However, I was blessed with some good relationships with people who showed me what forgiveness was like. The reality was that they actually forgave me when I needed it, when I behaved badly. Gradually I learned what it was to have one's wrongs forgiven rather than just forgotten after a period of time!

Finally, I had an experience with God where I did something that should have been unforgiveable, and yet I discovered that God both understood why I had behaved the way I had and inexplicably forgave me. Over a period of about a year I changed from someone who loathed Ash Wednesday to someone who was moved by the grace of a God who has done all that is necessary so that every one of us can receive whatever forgiveness we need if we will only accept it.

Then came the year when I was able to go forward and accept the ash cross on my forehead with joy. I had finally learned that a Christian was not someone who tries to be good but someone who knows they are not good but trusts God for the necessary forgiveness and healing. Trying to be good comes after forgiveness. Forgiven, I now try (and so often fail) to live up to the wonderful vision God apparently has of who I am.

How about you? If I am right about Christians being forgiven sinners it is no wonder we have so often got things wrong in the church and shown such a poor welcome and forgiveness to so many. We must so often break the heart of God but there is forgiveness there for me and for you. Do you want to put down that burden you carry and accept this gift from a loving God? What a wonderful way that would be of starting Lent and preparing for Easter!


### **Listening to God in Lent**

# Ongar & Shelley Ladies' Thursday Group Speaker Report St. Clare Hospice

Linda welcomed everyone back after the New Year. She also mentioned that the club desperately needs a treasurer.

Linda then introduced Stacey & Ellie who came to speak about St. Clare's. The NHS donate 44% of the 3 million which is needed each year to run the hospice which has 8 beds. They are supported by many local businesses who also sponsor some of the annual events. A lot of fundraising is required as well, which includes individual giving; money left in wills; their own lottery and income from the retail shops. Recently, they received a donation of an original Mary Quant dress and a Chanel bag! Both these raised a huge amount of money. There are 650 volunteers; some of them help at the hospice or in the community.

St Clare's has the facility to care for 100 patients, mostly taking place in the patient's home. A Bereavement Café is available for those who have lost someone recently or would like to stay in touch with people they know. There is also day therapy with workshops that support patients, giving them a better quality of life and a social aspect as well, plus a Compassionate Neighbours scheme where a volunteer can go and meet a patient in their own home for a chat and a cup of tea. Dementia clinics help patients with music sessions, taste and touch therapy and there is now a sensory garden for them. The Chaplin is always on hand with spiritual support for patients, families and the staff.

Linda thanked Stacey and Ellie for giving the club an interesting talk. Our next meeting will be on Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> March, when Keith Snow will be talking about "The Wildness of the Domestic Cat". We will also be reverting to our times of arriving at 7.30 pm for an 8 pm talk and new members are welcome.
