A report on the process taking place following the PCC's resolution to close St. Peter's Church

Representatives from the Church Buildings Council visited St. Peter's Church on 19th April and met with Jill Bowtle and Peter Dudeney. The Representatives stayed for several hours and made a thorough appraisal of the building and its contents as well as taking photographs.

They will produce a Church Buildings Report, a copy of which we shall receive. This evaluates the historic, architectural and aesthetic interest of the building, its contents and churchyard and looks at the potential for change in them.

It will be assessed by the Archdeacon and Diocesan Mission and Pastoral Committee (DMPC) in the next few weeks and it is expected to be considered by the Area and Diocesan Mission and Pastoral Committees in June and July.

If the Bishop then proposes closure the Church Commissioners will start the formal legal process and this will include advising all interested parties, and public notices (including publications such as the Ongar News) and is the time when written comments and objections can be made to the Commissioners. If any are received, they would be considered by the Commissioners Mission and Pastoral Committee (made up of bishops, clergy and laity from all over the country), and this can be a lengthy process.

Even if St. Peter's church is eventually closed, the PCC will still be responsible for the maintenance of the churchyard and this will also remain open for burials and public access.

We shall continue to update you as the process continues.

I'm continuing to lead a BCP Morning Prayer service via Zoom at 10.30 am on Sunday mornings for those of us unable to attend St. Martin's at present and new folk are always welcome. Just send an email to me at shirleydudeney@btinternet.com for the appropriate link.

PLEASE could you help us?

Back in December 2020 a chance conversation led to the birth of a new worshiping community, a new form of church.



You would have difficulty finding it as it has no church building, but it attracts a congregation similar in size to the 8 o'clock or mid-week communion services.

I'm talking about the 10.30 BCP Morning Prayer service which Peter and I host via Zoom each Sunday.

It was started as we gradually came out of the Coronavirus Lockdown, for those in our congregation and beyond who, because of their clinical vulnerability were unable to leave their home environment; and it continues to attract a loyal group of people who for one reason or another, are unable to attend church in the traditional way.

However, with Noelle and Paul's departure it's future is in jeopardy.

In order to support the other members of the ministry team, I have agreed to lead a service in St Martin's on the 3rd Sunday of the month; and I shall also be preaching at Greensted and St. Martin's on another Sunday in the month (usually the 2nd).

Whilst Peter is willing to lead the online services on these occasions, we do have a problem. He is the (only) reserve Sidesperson, and he will need to cover for a vacant slot on the third Sunday, which Paul Taylor used to do, and soon also on the second Sunday (whilst Gill Richardson recovers from a major operation). This would mean that the Zoom service could not take place on those Sundays.

Can you help? Would you be willing to act as a Sidesperson on one of these Sundays?

It is not too arduous, and as well as being fully trained you will always be working with an experienced person.
